Minibeast hunting

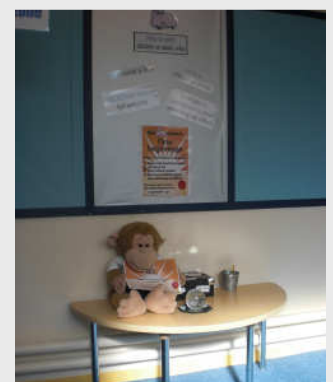
